L-273 Description & Prerequisites

The course is designed for local officials responsible for administering their local floodplain management ordinances as well as others involved in floodplain management activities. The course will focus on the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), general concepts of floodplain management, the Flood Insurance Study, using FEMA floodplain maps, effective administration of the local flood ordinance, and the relationship between floodplain management and flood insurance. Both FEMA and Alabama floodplain management staff will serve as instructors.

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Attendees should have at least 6 to 12 months experience in a floodplain management role, a basic understanding of the NFIP, be familiar with FEMA terminology, and have an understanding of a local Floodplain Administrator's responsibilities. <u>Recommend reading</u>: FEMA 480 – Floodplain Management Requirements, Alabama Floodplain Management Fact Sheet #1 - Duties and Responsibilities of the Floodplain Administrator (attached), and FEMA 258 – Guide to Flood Maps.

L-194 Description & Prerequisites

This advanced floodplain management course is a dynamic and interactive course covering National Flood Insurance Program Floodplain Rules and Regulations in Depth, Local Floodplain Manager Roles and Responsibilities, Letters of Map Change and Preparing for Post-Disaster Responsibilities. Each topic is designed to be discussed and reviewed in detail. Each of these topics is designed to be at a higher level of detail than any basic course. Developed and real-life scenarios will be examined and exercises will be conducted in each section to make sure participants not only understand the appropriate rules and regulations, but also why they are in effect and how to apply them. This course is exercise rich and participants can expect to be engaged throughout much of the course.

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Participants should have completed E273 or L273 - Managing Floodplain Development through the NFIP and either be a Certified Floodplain Manager (CFM) or have a minimum of 18 to 24 months full-time experience in a floodplain management role.

CFM Exam Information

To take the CFM Exam, you will need to register with ASFPM. To get a discounted exam fee, you will need to join ASFPM. You will submit your application to ASFPM and they will notify me of who has registered for the exam. This must be completed and submitted to ASFPM at least two weeks (July 21, 2017) prior to the exam date to ensure that your exam materials arrive in time.
